Prestigious Science Award to Jane Fitzgerald

Aspiring local science whiz's have been told they could be the key to solving some of the world's future problems.

Thirty-one Riverina Year 11 students were recently awarded Victor Chang School Science Awards for their excellent achievement and passion for science.

Local science whiz Jane Fitzgerald of Murrumburrah High was presented with her award by Victor Chang Cardiac Research Institute research scientist Dr Christopher Stanley at a Riverina presentation ceremony hosted by Junee High School.

Dr Stanley shared his journey in science from an inquisitive youngster tinkering with a chemistry set to his current role making discoveries "that nobody else in the world knows about yet".

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He urged students to follow their passions and dreams of pursuing a career in science.

Dr Stanley revealed that he had discovered chemicals that impact on blood pressure in certain people.

"The best part of science is that it allows you to contribute newly discovered knowledge to the world," Dr Stanley said.

"It can make a difference in people's lives."

Jane is a mature young lady who is growing in confidence. She has chosen a Science— Agriculture focussed academic load of Biology, Agriculture, Maths and Primary Industries. In Biology, Agriculture and Primary Industries Jane is placing first in the class and is consistently achieving in the top 4 of the cohort through her diligence and excellent time management skills in other subjects.

Jane participates in a wide variety of extra curricular activities including the Show team, and has exhibited at the Royal Sydney Show for the past 4 years, exhibiting the Victor Chang Charity Steer with the team.
