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If you can BREED them, we can FEED them.

Murrumburrah High School has once again proven a small rural High School can punch well above its weight. At the culmination of the Spring show season, Murrumburrah High School's show team travelled to Albury to compete in the cattle show ring. The students competed in the parading competition with 2 students, Gus Shea and Chad Webster successfully making it away for state paraders to compete at Sydney Royal in March 2018. Numerous ribbons were won in the junior judging and junior parade competitions.

What caused such pride amongst our students was the success of the show steers in both the judging on the hoof and later on the hook. The students took 9 steers down to Albury. 2 Steers were successful in the live placing with Thurloo Park Mincemeat 2nd in the Lightweight domestic competition and Fairall's Magic Mike 2nd in the Heavy Weight export competition.

In the Hook section, senior students were able to see the carcases hanging in the chillers and were over the moon to hear that MHS Boof – a young Blue \times Black Baldy steer placed 1st with a score of 94.5/100 in the middle weight division and Thurloo Park Mincemeat placing 1st with a score of 93.5/100 in the light weight division. A third steer Thurloo Park Murray placed 2nd in the middle weight division with 3 other steers placing in the top 6 placings in their respective weight classes. MHS Boof went on to be awarded Champion steer and Thurloo Park Mincemeat awarded Reserve Champion Steer.

These fantastic results were a follow up of the school being awarded Reserve Champion Heavy Weight steer at Sydney Royal with the Victor Chang Charity Steer – a limousin steer bred by Birubi Limousin Stud Borambola.

All steers had been fed on a ration processed at Kennetts Rural Supplies with oaten chaff supplied through the Harden Chaff Mill. Steers have access to high quality oaten hay supplied by Agstern Pastoral – Jugiong. With the new Bromar feed cart making bulk feed accessible the Murrumburrah Show Team can break, train and feed steers, with assistance from Wal Lovell, to the standard that has awarded steers with Champion Ribbons at Royal and local shows around the state.

The Murrumburrah High School would like to sincerely thank the local suppliers for the great quality products the show team are able to purchase and the service and advice that they give us. The Show team would also like to thank the truck drivers, studs and cattle producers and parents who continue to give assistance to the team.

A huge thankyou to Bernie Minogue who has trucked the Show Team for the past 17 years, Bernie is a much loved member of the Show Team and both you and your red truck will be missed at the school cattle yards. But the students would still like to pick him up and take him to the shows to keep them all in line.
