

Stage 5 English Studying Shakespeare

The eternal question? Why study Shakespeare?

Stage 5 English have started a close study of the great play Macbeth. One of the first activities undertaken was to consider why? Classes discussed the notion that each of his plays explore themes and ideas that are universal and remain relevant to us today. If your student is 16 years old they are eligible to enrol in the school's driver training program.


All students must be financial and sign an additional COVID consent form.


