Principal's Report

Welcome to the end of term 3.

It has been a long term, in fact it was and will be the longest school term of 2020 as Term 4 is slightly shorter. I would like to thank all the staff, students and their families for their work this term in getting through our daily school life whilst abiding by the ever-changing guidelines for schools to operate under. As of this week some new guidelines have now been released for term 4 school operation. As the staff version of this update is 23 pages long it would be easier to log onto the Department of Education website and follow the links to the COVID-19 page and read the changes, if you really have the desire, otherwise we will provide you with the guidelines that will affect our school next term.

Year 6 into 7 Orientation and transition activities will now be planned around these new guidelines and we will be in touch with our partner primary schools early next term also with specific planning. The changes have been constant this year and I am sure that we all look forward to 2021 and what it can bring for us.

I have very recently had a meeting with Hilltops Council regarding the parking and traffic flow at the Smith street entrance to the school. The meeting was originally planned to discuss parking concerns for families, however, I was informed at the meeting that Harden Council (pre-amalgamation) had made the decision back in 2014 that parking restriction signage would be installed on both sides of Smith Street for about 40m. Hilltops Council is having those signs installed over the coming school holidays. This will then be monitored by council and police for traffic flow and safety. The restrictions will mean that during the 40km/hr reduced speed school times, no one will be able to park in those zones at all, not even for drop off and pick up. So, from day 1 next term please drop off and pick up your child(ren) outside these marked zones for everyone's safety. Unfortunately, this means that students will need to walk that little bit further to get into and out of school.

My final message for term 3 is to congratulate our new incoming school captains. Congratulations Jordan Phelan and Amity Sheargold on your selection by the staff and student body, you will make fine leaders and representatives of the students of the school and of the wider community. I look forward to working with you over next term and 2021.


Each member of the team has grown as a debater, developing in skill, style and confidence. We look forward to the next round against Engadine High School.


Paraders Competition

HSC student advice

We know our students and staff have worked hard for the HSC. The safety of our students and staff remains of utmost importance. This year extra arrangements are in place to ensure that any disruption due to COVID-19 will have minimal impact on HSC exams.

Our school has put in place a number of contingencies to help ensure exams run as smoothly as possible.

The exams have been scheduled and our school has arrangements in place for exams to proceed as planned. It is important that students review their timetable and plan well so they turn up for their exams on time, healthy and rested.

Any student with a pre-existing condition, that presents similarly to flu-like symptoms, should be planning now and speak to their doctor/GP. The GP can provide a medical certificate ahead of the exams to ensure they are not sent home.

If on the day of the exam your student feels unwell with flu-like symptoms, they should stay home and get tested. HSC students are prioritised for COVID-19 test results.

It's important to note that all students will be asked if they are well before entering exam rooms.

We want all our students to sit their exams but sometimes things happen. If your child is unwell and misses their exam, contact the school. Students who are unwell will be eligible for the illness and misadventure provision with NESA.

If there are any changes to exam arrangements we will communicate with HSC students by telephone or text message. This will be the *only source of communication* for these types of notifications. If in doubt, please call the school.

We wish all our students well in the upcoming exams.


