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# Principal's Report

Welcome to the end of Week 8.

Operating a school under COVID-19 guidelines for schools has proved rather interesting at times. I am very proud of the way that students and staff have been able to work though the restrictions and provide a safe and happy learning environment at school. Given what is occurring in Sydney it is difficult to see anything changing for Term 4.

I have been quite busy on a number of lengthy online Zoom/Teams meetings.... Which can be quite draining, but are valuable in providing that connection with other schools and having those professional discussions that can then help the students in each of our local schools, through collaboration and idea sharing. It has been also very handy not having to leave the school to travel to many of the regular termly Principal's meetings that I would usually attend. It leaves me at school more often, which is a good thing.

Our Canteen has just had an unexpected Hilltops Council canteen audit by the inspector. Rosie did a fabulous job and we passed with flying colours. Well done Rosie and keep up the good work.

Students from Years 8 and 10 have been currently having discussions with staff and family in regards to their subject choices for 2021. Year 8 students had to choose their electives to study for the next two years, whilst Year 10 get to choose their pattern of study for Year 11/12. English remains the only compulsory course for senior school but all students choose Mathematics as well at our school. School staff will examine all these selections and start the process of setting classes and planning a new timetable for 2021. Given the range of subjects we offer, some courses may not run but all students are aware and have given backup options just in case. Next year our school will also have one student enrolled in Extension Science for Year 12 with Aurora College, one student studying Industrial Technology—Graphics through Distance Education and four students studying courses through TAFE campuses. In fact, two students will be going to Young campus, one to Wagga campus and one to Goulburn campus on Wednesdays. Each of these students has a particular pathway to a career that requires them to be part of these courses as well as a full subject selection back at school.

As a final mention this week, I would like to wish Year 11 all the best for their upcoming final preliminary examinations in Week 10. I hope that they are all revising and studying intensively in preparation. Teachers will mark these and provide feedback early next term before reports are then issued for Year 11. Term 4 marks the start of the HSC year for this cohort.

## DRAMA








# IVY Challenge
